Walk down memory Lane - Part 7

In this Part, we will connect all the twenty squares we made in the last two Parts. It will be wonderful to see how they all unite and give your centerpiece a different view. It will also let your work grow.

Are you ready to join some Biscornu squares? Let's go!

Pattern used:

No patterns are used this week as we still work with the squares from all the Biscornu patterns.

Yarn and hook:

In all parts, colors A and B are used. However, in part 7, we only will use those two colors. Tineke's Masterpiece version will use all three colors in all parts. For both versions, crochet hook size 4.0mm is used.

Tineke's masterpiece color use:

As Tineke only used three colors to create the same project, her use of colors was divided into different ways. Therefore, behind each instruction, you will find a color between (). This indicates the use of the color Tineke used.

Instructions:

You will now have twenty squares ready, and it is time to connect them in 4 Rows of 5 squares. Divide them as you wish – I have chosen to switch between white and grey tiles to give a playful effect. I divided them into these 4 Rows to connect. The green lines show the sides that will be joined.



How do you connect the squares?


Take Color A.(B) Join the squares together with a simple SS. Attach two squares with stitch markers.

Turn to the backside of the tiles and make a SS through the inner loops of both sides. This way, you will leave the outer loops unworked and close like a zipper.

When working in a ch2 corner at the beginning or the end, work a SS through both to join. Do this on every side; the squares need to be attached. Of course, you can also use the mattress stitch to sew the squares together.



Once you connect five squares, you will have the following result:




Do this with all four Rows of squares.

Next, you will crochet a Row of stitches at the top side of five connected squares. The red line on the photo above shows you where to work it.

Take Color A (A), and attach it in the ch2-crn at the Right Side of the work. Ch1 (doesn't count as stitch), 1sc in ch2-crn, (1sc in next 33 sts, sc2tog over next two ch2-crns) 4 times, 1sc in next 33 sts, 1sc in last ch2-crn. Fasten off Color A.

Repeat this process for all 4 square Rows. Weave in all ends so far.





Now it is time to attach the Row of squares to a side of the center. One side of the center holds 171 stitches, and the Row of squares also has 171 stitches so they can be easily connected. Take notice that the ch2-crns of the center square are not used and are left unworked. Lay the square Row with the Right Side facing the Right Side of the center square, and connect the two sides by making sc's through stitches simultaneously. You do this with Color B (B), It will look like this:



Once a Row of squares is attached to the center, it will look like this:



Repeat the whole process for the other three sides as well. The result will be all four Rows of squares attached to the center:



Weave in all ends.

So far, Part 7 of the walk down memory Lane blanket. The blanket is expanding and getting into a new dimension. In the next Part, we will finish the empty corners!
