

Walk down memory Lane – Part 9

We have reached the end of our walk. We will use the last pattern, which is the border of the Seaside Serendipity blanket. The border of this blanket is made out of the many colors I used in that design and consists of moss stitches. The result of this stitch delivers a perfect match between colors I wanted for the sea theme at that time. I will not ask you to buy that pattern, but you can crochet along with this Part as it is just a simple stitch. I didn't use all colors out of the 22 I used for this blanket, but if you want to, you can easily do it as this border is super easy, and you can extend it as much as you like.

Yarn and hook:

In all parts, colors A and B are used. In part 9, we will use all color sets. So take Color C-G from all the sets for this Part. Tineke's Masterpiece version will use all three colors in all parts. For both versions, a crochet hook size **5.0mm** is used.

Tineke's masterpiece color use:

As Tineke only used three colors to create the same project, here use of colors was divided into different ways. Therefore, behind each instruction, you will find a color between (). This indicates the use of the color Tineke used.

Instructions:

For the border, It is essential to take a larger crochet hook. We gain up a full-size crochet hook; I advise using a 5.0mm hook size. Take the hook and start with Color C of the green color set. Attach Color C in any ch2-crnr.

R1: Ch1, *1sc-ch2-1sc in ch2-crnr, (ch1, sk st, 1sc in next st) till last st on side. Ch1, sk st. Rep from * 3 more times. Ss in top of first st to connect. Fasten off Color C. [4 sides of 123sc and 122 times a ch1-sp/ 4 times a ch2-crnr] **(B)**

Now take Color D of the green color set and attach it in any ch2-crnr.

R2: Ch1, *1sc-ch2-1sc in ch2n-crnr, (ch1, sk st, 1sc in next ch1-sp) till last st on side. Ch1, sk st. Rep from * 3 more times. Ss in top of first st to connect. Fasten off Color D. [4 sides of 124sc and 123 times a ch1-sp / 4 times a ch2-crnr] **(C)**

R3: With Color E of the green color set, repeat R2. [4 sides of 125sc and 124 times a ch1-sp/ 4 times a ch2-crnr] **(B)**

R4: With Color F of the green color set, repeat R2. [4 sides of 126sc and 125 times a ch1-sp/ 4 times a ch2-crnr] **(C)**

You can keep repeating Round 2 as long as you like; at every Round, one sc and one ch1-sp will increase. So I used the purple color set next and used colors D-E-F-G of it. After that, I took the brown color set and used colors C-D-E-F of it. Then, at last, I used the blue color set and used colors D-E-F-G of it.

Last Round: Take Color B **(B)** and attach to any ch2-crn. Ch1, * 1sc-ch2-1sc in ch2-crn, (sk next st, 2sc in next ch1-sp) over entire side till next ch2-crn, sk next st. Repeat from * 3 more times. Ss in top of first st to connect. Fasten off Color B.

Weave in all ends and block the blanket for the best outcome.

I hope you enjoyed this walk with me through five years of crochet designing. I hope you discovered some interesting pieces I created that were somewhat unknown. Enjoy your beautiful blanket and heads up to the following hundred designs! Thank you for crocheting with me and my patterns!
